The Bellbird's First Ever Spelling Bee

This year we are holding our first ever whole-school Spelling Bee and it promises to be an exciting event. Before Easter, children will be given a list of words to learn in addition to their weekly spellings. Children will be tested on the words in three spelling tests after Easter. The children with the highest average score over the three tests will be chosen to represent their team (Amethyst, Emerald, Ruby or Sapphire) for the School Final in May. Following the results of the School Final, a team of four Key Stage 2 children will be chosen to represent The Bellbird at the Network CB23 Grand Final Spelling Bee Competition. The final will be held after school at Sawston Village College on **Wednesday 10th June**. We are hoping that the event will be great motivation for children to learn their spellings! We will send out more information about the event over the next few weeks.

The School Library – New Books

During February and March, a range of new picture books and non-fiction books will be available in the school library for the children to borrow. The new books have been funded by FABS and we are very grateful to all of the families who support the many fundraising events which take place throughout the school year.

World Book Day – Thursday 5th March 2020


