

Weekly Maths activities

Try:

- Go on a shape hunt around your house or local area. You could choose to focus on 2D or 3D shapes or a mixture of both. Keep a tally of the shapes you find.
- Create a guess my shape game. Draw a shape and cover with a paper flap. On the flap write a series of clues about the shape. E.g. I am a 3D shape. I have 4 vertices. I have 4 faces. All my faces are triangles – What am I?
- Write out a timetable of your day – showing each time on a clock face.

Don't forget to practise times tables and/or check Mathematics for alternative maths activities.

Weekly reading activities

Look at poem called Storm by David Windle at

Read the poem carefully.

Can you identify all the interesting and powerful verbs used in the poem? E.g. lashed. Write a list of all the ones you find. Remember a verb is a “doing” or action word. If you unsure of the meaning of any words, make sure you use a dictionary or ask an adult.

Can you find examples of alliteration? (the same letter or sound at the start of two closely connected words.) Write down all the examples you find.

Challenge – Can you write a poem about a storm using some of the words you found?

Weekly writing activities

Poetry – The Sound Collector

Look: Read The Sound Collector by Roger McGough. (Find the poem on Purple Mash under English Week 11) Read through several times. Read to members of your family. Can you think of actions and perform the poem? Can you memorise it off by heart?

Find: Underline all the nouns in the poem, using a felt tip. Underline all the verbs, using a different colour pen. Circle the rhyming words. What patterns do you notice?

Try: Try writing your own poem in the style of The Sound Collector. You can use the first and last verse in your own poem. Your job is to write the middle, imagining that **either** the sounds of the rainforest have been stolen **or** the sounds of the seaside. Firstly, list all the nouns you would find at your chosen place. Secondly, think of verbs to go with the nouns. E.g. The hissing of the snakes or The crashing of the waves. Next, try writing 4 or 5 verses using your ideas. Challenge - can you make the second and fourth line of each verse rhyme? Finally, when you have finished, write it up neatly and perform it to someone in your family.

You could also read through and have a go at the activities on the PowerPoint saved on Purple Mash under 'Topic Week 11.'


Challenge: Can you think of different ways that the weather affects us? E.g. Need to wear sun cream on a sunny day to avoid getting sunburnt. Sunshine can produce solar power. Rain helps crops to grow etc.

Music

Click on assignments – Music Explorer for Recorder
Select beginner B, A, G. Click next, then select a different style of music from last week e.g. motown or pop – and pick a tempo, click Next. You can then drag 'notes blobs' to compose your own piece of music.



Play around with different options at the bottom to focus on just rhythm, change pitch of notes, continue using "blobs" or use formal notation.



Computing

Go to your 2dos on purple mash and find task called 2do:Weather Map.

Click on the green circle with a plus sign to find a picture of a map. Select the one you want.

Drag the pictures of different weathers on to the map and resize.

Write a brief report about the weather on the bottom. E.g. It will be mainly sunny in the north east, but there will be scattered showers in the south. Etc.

Art - Weather

The British weather can be very changeable, sunshine one minute and then rain. Explore how you could show different weather through a range of art techniques – drawing, painting, collage. Some pictures for inspiration are here...
