


French:

We will be focusing on our understanding of French festivals, locations, prepositions and descriptions based on French towns.

Art/DT:

Pencil sketches and line drawings of architecture and of the village of Sawston. In DT, we will plan, design and sew our own pencil cases.



RE:

Why humanists don't believe in God. How do humanists decide what to believe?

PSHE:

Sex & Relationships Education and Body Image: Revision of changes during puberty; being able to describe the main stages of how a baby is made, using some scientific vocabulary.

Managing Changes & My Emotions: How to manage the change to secondary school.


Mathematics:

The first term will be spent consolidating our knowledge and understanding of the maths curriculum taught in Key stage 2, in preparation for secondary school. After half term we'll be looking at calculator work and longer investigations, developing the children's reasoning and logic skills.

"The Sawston Scene"

The children will get to know the wonders of their village of Sawston. To begin with, we'll look at its expansion over time through map work. We'll then progress onto a quick study of Tudor history and the stories surrounding Sawston Hall, with all its rich history. The children will also have an opportunity to create their own "Sawston Historical Walk".

Regular Year 6 homework will continue during the summer term. This will be replaced in the last few weeks by an extended project on their chosen secondary school.



Computing:

- Blogging and how to communicate appropriately online.
- Looking at networks and the infrastructure of the internet.
- Creating online quizzes from research.

PE:

Swimming: Year 6 are swimming at Sawston Village College on Monday mornings

Games: Learning the rules, skills and tactics of rounders and cricket.

Athletics: We'll be doing a variety of field and track activities.

Gym: Movement, including jumping, leaping and rolling.

Science:

This topic is closely linked to our learning in PSHE this term. We will begin by learning about human development, the human life cycle and human reproduction. Alongside this, we will focus on the changes, which occur during puberty, and the effects that puberty can have physically and emotionally.

Music

Children will learn new tunes on the ukulele and glockenspiel (and maybe even the recorder!). We hope to include these instruments in our end-of-year production, where we'll also have the opportunity to develop our singing skills!
