Communication and Language

- Listening to stories, anticipating key events and responding with comments or answers to questions.
- Answering 'how' and 'why' questions in response to stories or events.
- Vocabulary, icicles, snowman, sled, frost, frozen, igloo, hibernation,

Expressive Art and Design

- Sing songs, making music and dancing
- Colour mixing pale blue and other arctic colours
- Experiment with colour, design & texture.

Mathematics

Numbers: Exploring composition and subitising of numbers to five.

- Exploring making the numbers 6, 7 and 8.



- Comparing groups of up to 10.
- Children recognise that numbers can be made up of a whole and part. E.g. 4= 3 + 1.
- Numbers bonds to 5. Making and representing these numbers in different ways.

Shape, space and measures: Children use everyday language to talk about time.

- Sequencing activities in the day, looking at night and day
- Children order and sequence simple events.

Literacy

➤ Use phonic knowledge in their reading and to write words and phrases that are phonetically plausible

- Read and write some irregular common (tricky) words.
- Enjoy non-fiction and fiction texts about penguins
